

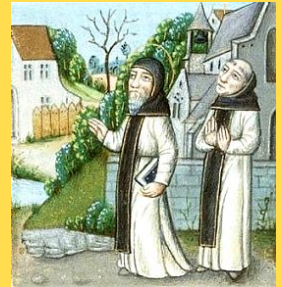

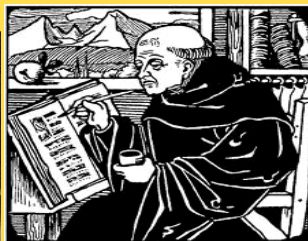
"Ancient sounds and silences, the perfect companions for contemplation, work and study."



Abbazia di Spineto, for a thousand years since 1085, has been a place of learning and rest on the pilgrimage route to Rome. Today, a fully restored 800 hectares estate with 11 farmhouses and many land based projects, fulfilling its

In ***Process and Pilgrimage***, wholeness is something one continually meets along the way, after one has set out in a state of trust as to the possible outcome.



Space and Program

This is the third year of **Process and Pilgrimage** events in Italy. Pilgrimage is the archetypal religious practice, in which the ancient route is re-lived for a contemporary rediscovery of our living place. In adding together moments of significance, critical points of choice have been discovered, junctions at which education, health and society can switch direction.

The **Journey School** identifies the source of our modern confusion in the way knowledge is appropriated to serve different ideological stories. In making learning something active and participative, the reasons for ideological conflict disappear. At its root, all divide results from the first lesson of separation of these facts from those untruths. In beginning with the freedom of addressing others in a living process of discovery, the world turns to a direction of inner worth. **Ilan Pappé asks:** What should such a school be like, when the husk of knowledge opens to reveal the fruit of a living truth? Can it seed within a situation of conflict a common question of who we are?

Something of what a living science might look like can be imagined in the work of **Graham Jones** and Irun Cohen, on using the **immune system** as a reporter of the body's own state of **health**. Instead of us applying a medicinal paradigm, can we not tune in to how something as impressively immense in its function as the immune system, is able to recognize and keep track of a whole state of being? This new direction/focus in health research is about experiencing the being of the world first hand.

Philip Franses contrasts a square way of doing science that boxes everything in to their isolated domain, with a round way of holding the world, where relationship finds its optimal form. The creation of a divinely inspired space is also the goal of this event, wherein humanity finds its own way forward, respectful of one other, the earth and our common task.

Satish Kumar reflects from the Monk's perspective on the journey that brought him, fifty years ago to walk the world in a call for peace. At the Sarteano event, where outcomes will be presented to the local community, Satish will also launch the Italian translation of his book *Earth Pilgrim*. (*Satish was writing this book on pilgrimage when in a conversation with Philip about the science of process, Process and Pilgrimage was born.*)

So we come back through re-aligning education and health, to living, on the land, with each other. **Spineto** is about "entering in our deep and 'green' silence, meeting each other, studying, knowing, working together...experiencing emotions too." Do join us in the journey!

Biographies

Ilan Pappé is an author and one of the world's leading historians of the Middle East, with a distinctive view of Arab-Israeli relations. He is a Professor in the Institute for Arab and Islamic Studies at the University of Exeter, the Director of the European Centre for Palestine Studies in Exeter and the Co-Director of the Exeter Centre for Ethno-Political Studies. He was the academic head and founder of the Institute for Peace Studies in Givat Haviva (1992-2000), Israel and the Chair of the Emil Touma Institute for Palestinian Studies in Haifa(2000-2008).



Graham Jones, Associate Professor at the University of New England (Australia) has been involved in a wide range of research applying basic chemical, bio-chemical and immunological techniques to the study of human biology. He is discipline lead in clinical biochemistry and immunology. By applying context specific metaphors he aims to re-enchant the biological sciences.



Philip Franses is the originator of the Process and Pilgrimage inquiry. He is a lecturer on the MSc in Holistic Science teaching Complexity Theory at Schumacher College. He is also the Chief Editor of the Holistic Science Journal.

Marilisa Cuccia is not only our host at the Abbey of Spineto but the original visionary who has transformed it in the past 23 years from being a spectacular ruin with an illustrious past to the vibrant thriving enterprise of both business and charitable projects that it is today.



Satish Kumar was only nine years old when he renounced the world and joined the wandering brotherhood of Jain monks. At the age of eighteen, he left the monastic order and became a campaigner, working to turn Gandhi's vision of renewed India and a peaceful world into reality. Fired by the example of Bertrand Russell, he undertook an 8,000 mile peace pilgrimage, walking from India to America without any money delivering packets of 'peace tea' to the leaders of the four nuclear powers. Since 1973, he has been Editor of Resurgence magazine.
